POST /subscriptions

Description

Subscribe. The POST method creates a new subscription. This method shall follow the provisions specified in the tables 5.4.18.3.1-1 and 5.4.18.3.1-2 for URI query parameters, request and response data structures, and response codes. As the result of successfully executing this method, a new "Individual subscription" resource as defined in clause 5.4.3 shall have been created. This method shall not trigger any notification. Creation of two "Individual subscription" resources with the same callback URI and the same filter can result in performance degradation and will provide duplicates of notifications to the NFVO, and might make sense only in very rare use cases. Consequently, the VNFM may either allow creating an "Individual subscription" resource if another "Individual subscription" resource with the same filter and callback URI already exists (in which case it shall return the "201 Created" response code), or may decide to not create a duplicate "Individual subscription" resource (in which case it shall return a "303 See Other" response code referencing the existing "Individual subscription" resource with the same filter and callback URI).

The POST method initiates cancelling an ongoing VNF lifecycle operation while it is being executed or rolled back, i.e. the related "Individual VNF LCM operation occurrence" resource is either in "STARTING" or "PROCESSING" or "ROLLING_BACK" state. This method shall follow the provisions

specified in the tables 5.4.17.3.1-1 and 5.4.17.3.1-2 for URI query parameters, request and response data structures, and response codes. Before returning the "202 Accepted" response, the VNFM shall update the "isCancelPending" and "cancelMode" attributes in the representation of the parent resource according to the provisions in clause 5.5.2.13. In case of success of processing the asynchronous request: 1) If the request has been processed in "STARTING" state, the "operationState" attribute in the representation of the parent resource shall be changed to "ROLLED_BACK". 2) If the request has been processed in "PROCESSING" or "ROLLING_BACK" state, the "operationState" attribute in the representation of the parent resource shall be changed to "FAILED_TEMP".

In both cases, the VNFM shall update the "isCancelPending" and "cancelMode" attributes in the representation of the parent resource according to the provisions in clause 5.5.2.13 to reflect the new status, and the applicable "result" notification according to clause 5.6.2.2 shall be emitted to indicate that the execution of the underlying VNF LCM operation occurrence has temporarily failed. Due to race conditions, the processing of the actual operation that is to be cancelled may eventually still succeed, in which case the "operationState" attribute in the representation of the parent resource shall represent the result of that operation, rather than the result of the cancellation.
